This is the first of our school's twice termly "From the Heart" Newsletters, after what I'm sure has been a chance for families to enjoy a wonderful Summer break, enjoy plenty of rest, and to maximise the opportunities to have fun together.

On behalf of all our teachers and staff, I extend a very warm welcome to all families who have joined Sacred Heart this year. My hope for you as parents, is that your association with our school is a long and happy one, and that you experience a partnership that enables you to offer your support of and involvement in your children's learning and faith development. It is now widely accepted that when a strong partnership exists between schools and parents, children fare better with their achievements and feelings of wellbeing.

This year's fabulous **2024 Welcome Event** on our Oval, was a wonderful chance for everyone to commence the new year excitedly, and for existing and new faces to connect and enjoy coming together. I hope that you enjoy some of the photos in our Social Media posts. A special thank you is extended to your hard working **2024 Parents and Friends Executive** and their Class Representatives, on executing such a fabulous event to start the very warm year.

Our new term continues to progress at a full pace, and our children and teachers seem to have made significant achievements over these past weeks at school. I'm very happy to have returned after a summer that seems to continue with warm days, and I envisage 2024 together as another wonderful year in which we continue to not only "Strive for Excellence", but for us all to "Achieve our Excellence!"

We have commenced the 2024 School Year with enrolments numbering 226 children, from 166 families, and with 24 staff members. We welcome the return of our staff and embrace our newest teachers.

We welcome the following new teaching staff to their roles: Miss Sarah Van Kesteren, Mrs Lori Coenen and Mrs Elizabeth Uchanski, Mrs Gemma MacMillan, Mrs Sonya McCormack and Education Assistant, Miss Britney Vanderwall. Our new Leadership structure sees Mrs Carolyn Perlini as the sole Assistant Principal, and our middle leaders, Mrs Laura Taylor's and Miss Catherine Boyes' roles as Curriculum Co-ordinator and Early Years Co-ordinator respectively, is providing us with a wonderful opportunity to grow competence and leadership in others.

All staff were commissioned to their roles at the Ash Wednesday Mass, and together with all our School Advisory Council members, and Parents and Friends Executive members, and our Year 6 student leaders, were blessed by Father Stephen.

I am sure our School Community will continue to make our new staff members feel welcomed and supported in their roles.

We also have the wonderful news to share with the school community, that our school's continued journey with the City Country Partnership (CCP) that commenced officially this year, and will continue for the next three years, will see Mrs Taylor and Mrs Perlini be in Broome at St Mary's College in coming weeks, as we prepare for their participation in the CEWA STEM Showcase here in Perth in August.

We've also hosted some of the Broome staff earlier this term, and also undertook a campus visit to our additional partners in this venture, Chisholm College in Bedford.

Our work as a leading STEM school, for both our local and statewide CEWA networks, continues to provide us with the opportunity to grow leadership in our staff, and present our boys and girls with chances to shine. The CCP will fund our delivery of Professional Learning in regional and metropolitan CEWA school settings, and also our further purchase of STEM resources for our students. We are immensely proud of this achievement, and also continue this work in the Goldfields cluster, as we explore the delivery of our Professional Learning to St Mary's in Kalgoorlie, with the assistance of our very generous support provided by Bradken.

Each year, the summer break provides us with the opportunity to attend to designated maintenance and scheduled improvement projects. The following items have been attended to over our January break:-

- All classroom and admin Air conditioners serviced.
- Termite treatments and spraying.
- All classrooms' carpet shampooing.
- Pressure cleaning in the toilet blocks, and all lunch areas.
- All windows in the school cleaned.
- Pressure cleaning of covered area roofing and ramp balustrades.
- New fencing to the lower Playground.
- Painting of Toilet blocks and the Admin entrances / passageways.
- Oval corina and fertilisina.
- Maintenance in Early Childhood Education Naturescape Playground.
- Reticulation repairs and servicing.

A special thank you to our Year Six students, for their preparations and service as they have presented and two of this term's Assemblies. It marks the beginning of their leadership roles, and I'm confident they are going to conduct themselves admirably throughout the year.

I chanced upon the following reflection some time ago, and in the context of us all trying to become more like Jesus during this Lenten period, it may be useful as we embark on our 2024 Season of Lent - I hope you enjoy it!

# **FASTING AND FEASTING (DURING LENT)**

LENT should be more than a time of fasting- It should also be a joyous season of feasting. LENT is a time to fast from certain things, and to feast on others. It is a season in which we should:

Fast from judging others...feast on the Christ indwelling in them.

Fast from emphasis on differences...feast on the unity of all life.

Fast from thoughts on illness...feast on the healing power of God.

Fast from words that pollute...feast on phrases that purify.

Fast from worry...feast on trust.

Fast from discontent...feast on gratitude.

Fast from suspicion...feast on charitableness.

Fast from self-concern...feast on compassion for others.

Fast from anger...feast on patience.

Fast from pessimism....feast on optimism.

Fast from complaining...feast on appreciation.

Fast from hostility...feast on friendliness.

Fast from personal anxiety...feast on the power of God.

Fast from idle gossip.....feast on silence or find a word of praise.

Fast from shadows of sorrow...feast on Christ's glorious Resurrection.

Fast from unrelenting pressures...feast on unceasing prayer.

Fast from problems that overwhelm...feast on prayer and confidence in God's help.

#### **Education**

Our teachers have settled smoothly into routines, planning and timetables, and are so pleased with the enthusiasm of their classes, as everyone tackles their studies.

We were delighted to be able to conduct the **2024 Parent Information Sessions** as digital experiences. These sessions are planned as an opportunity to inform parents about curriculum content, classroom rules and routines, homework expectations etc. Our teachers prepared comprehensive handouts and digital presentations, and the Curriculum Outlines for each level have been forwarded to all families via Seesaw.

These current weeks in classrooms are important as the data collection period, and assessments and standardised tests are currently being completed. These results will enable teachers to plan for both necessary enrichment opportunities, and any needed intervention strategies. As always, preparation for any testing situation begins with adequate rest- these first weeks at school can be very tiring, and combined with our currently warm weather, can really affect our boys and girls-early nights are called for!

All good work is grounded in good communication, and I urge parents to always make contact in the first instance, with their child's Class Teacher if they have queries regarding their child's learning and progress.

The expected warm weather that usually accompanies Term 1, sees our school provide adequately for the children's learning in their air conditioned and air ventilated classrooms, and their break times will sometimes see these areas and the air conditioning being utilised. Please don't forget to freeze water bottles and send along fruits and or vegetables only, for the daily afternoon's **Crunch and Sip** break. Children's water bottles must accompany them every day, and these are permitted (and the children are directed) to be refilled throughout the day from our chilled water fountain units.

#### Community

I value and appreciate the building of strong and positive relationships with all our community. It is so vital in a Catholic School that we communicate with each other through the eyes of understanding and compassion – our attitude each day, will be a model of reflection to our students, parents, and to our community. I have been very impressed with the level of engagement that our students have already demonstrated over these past two weeks here at school.

Our two, high functioning parent bodies within our school, the **Sacred Heart School Advisory Council** and the **Sacred Heart Parents and Friends Association** have conducted their opening year meetings.

There are many positive and exciting initiatives planned to support our children, their necessary school resources and of course, the building of community, and we look forward to many happy occasions together this year. I would encourage everyone to watch for communication from your

**Class Representatives** regarding events and plans, and additionally, to be on the look out for casual get togethers and play picnics in the park, that offer families the chance to forge friendships.

# **Early Years Co-ordinator Introduction**



A warm welcome to our Sacred Heart community as we commence the new school year. My name is Catherine Boyes and this year I hold the role of Early Years Coordinator, Pre-Kindy, and Kindy teacher. Early Years Education encompasses Pre-Kindy through to Year Two. The Early Years Learning Framework (EYLF) describes childhood as a state of 'Belonging, Being and Becoming' with my role focusing on children being immersed in experiences that develop their sense of belonging, allow them to be themselves and enjoy the moments of childhood as they grow, learn,

and develop. Working alongside the Leadership Team and staff, I work to ensure quality, up-to-date Early Years Education is delivered in both the indoor and outdoor learning spaces in accordance with the EYLF and National Quality Standard (NQS).

These first few weeks are focused on building respectful and reciprocal relationships between staff, children, and families, establishing routines as children become familiar with their new learning environment, and 'beginning of the year' assessments to ensure learning experiences are meeting each child where they are at. We have already seen such growth from the children in these first six weeks as they have settled into the new school year, developing a sense of 'belonging' in their new environment. Each teacher has fostered these relationships, established these routines, and connected with your children in their own way, and I hope that you have enjoyed seeing some of the learning that has occurred so far on Seesaw.

"It takes a village to raise a child" is one of my favourite quotes and to be part of each of your children's 'village' is an honour. Early Years Education is my passion in life, and I cannot do my role as a teacher or Co-ordinator without working in partnership with our Sacred Heart families. Where possible, I want to have parents, families, and the wider school community actively involved in our Early Childhood initiatives, with the first project being our 'Early Years Charter'.

# **Project Compassion Boxes 2024**

By now, each student should have brought home their Project Compassion boxes for Lent. Project Compassion is Caritas Australia's annual fundraising and awareness raising appeal endorsed by the Australian Catholic Bishops, which brings thousands of Australians in solidarity with the world's poor to help end poverty, promote justice and uphold dignity. Project Compassion 2024 focuses on 'For All Future Generations'. This theme has been drawn from the story of the burning bush in Exodus 3:1-20.

One day, Moses's sheep wander off and he suddenly encounters a bush that is burning but not consumed. God tells Moses that he has heard the cry of his people. God responds to injustice and chooses Moses to speak to Pharaoh. Moses is scared but God promises 'I will be with you.' All the time, God remains a mystery. Moses wants more detail, so God simply says that this is the same God who has been longing for justice for the whole of history: 'By this name I shall be invoked for all future generations.'

As God called Moses, so now God calls us to work 'for all future generations.'

In line with this theme, this year's Project Compassion stories include Ronita, a 22-year-old mother of two in the Philippines. Ronita returned school to complete her education with the help of the Faithful Companions of Jesus, securing a brighter future for her family.

There is also the story of Memory, who was selected by local leaders in her community in Malawi as a candidate for a vocational skills course. She now works for one of Malawi's largest power companies and is a role model and trailblazer for other young women.

Supporters will also hear from Leaia who built her own home from recycled scraps and is better able to care for her five children, and regularly sends them to school, thanks to a new water tank that affords her a consistent water supply.

Kirsty Robertson, Caritas Australia CEO, said, "During Lent, we are invited to take up the call to fast, pray and give alms. From natural disasters to widespread conflict, the events of the past year mean that many communities need your support. #### **Finance News**

Annual fee statements were emailed to all families during January/February 2024. Please note, that unless advised otherwise, the statements are sent to the female parent/guardian. Should you not have received your Annual Statement please contact our Finance Officer, Linda Robertson, on 9253 2502. All information pertaining to your account, along with your payment options which are detailed after the fee statement section, is included on this statement.

Every family is required to complete and submit a new Payment Options form each year. Payment arrangements carried over from last year are not automatically adjusted to allow for any increase/decrease in fees. It is a school requirement to complete the payment options form to ensure the correct number of instalments, at the correct payment amount, are being made for your fees to be paid by 30 November 2024. The Payment Options Form was due on the 16 February 2024. Should you not have returned your form please do so, via email finance@shpsh.wa.edu.au or direct to the office.

Health Care Card Fee Discount Scheme – To access the Health Care Card Assistance Scheme, an eligible means-tested Centrelink card must be presented to our Administration Office and an HCC Fee Discount Scheme form completed. The card must be in the name of the parent /guardian who is responsible for the payment of fees. Should a valid card not be presented upon the expiry of an existing card, any previous discount applied, will be reversed and the applicable fees and charges will be invoiced for your account in line with the expired card. Please note that the initial discount is applied for the entire year, and adjustments are only made upon the expiry of the card.

Pre-Kindergarten fees are not eligible for the discount.
