Our older classes continued with their Lenten preparations, and celebrated the Sacrament of Penance in our chapel yesterday with Fr Stephen and Fr Marius. I hope you get the opportunity to share with your children, how this Sacrament of healing has offered them strength and spiritual support.

#### **Education**

The beautiful autumn sunshine continues, but chillier mornings have signalled the impending need for red jumpers and tracksuit tops!

As Term Two commences, our boys and girls will hopefully be fully prepared for the Winter season with their new Winter Uniform items- parents are also reminded that we offer a two-week period of transition, in order for any new items to be sourced.

One World Uniforms encourage all families to place their orders for winter stock as soon as possible, to ensure supply, and as communicated earlier this term, will also offer a delivery option via Australia Post. **Uniform Purchases-**Correct school uniform items are only able to be purchased through One World Uniforms. During the Term Break, One World Uniforms is open on Wednesday  $10^{th}$  April from 9:00 am - 11:30 am and 1:30 pm - 4:30 pm. It is also open on Monday  $15^{th}$  April 1:30 pm - 4:30 pm and Wednesday  $17^{th}$  from 9:00 am - 11:30 am and 1:30 pm - 4:30 pm at 10 Cowle St West Perth, and can be contacted on **9227 7977.** 

All children must be in Full Winter Uniform in Term Two and Term Three. The Sacred Heart navy winter jackets with the school emblem, are optional items (not compulsory) and may be purchased through One World Uniforms. Please note however, that this is the *only winter jacket* that is permissible, if extra warmth is sought.

**Second Hand Uniforms** can be purchased from the Parents and Friends Association, by arranging access to the stock, via the School Office.

# **Grooming Requirements**

- Students are encouraged to wear their School and Sports Uniform items correctly, and take pride in their
  personal appearance ie, clean, pressed items are required at school daily, school shoes are to be polished,
  school shirts are to be worn tucked in.
- Students with hair that is beyond collar length, must have their hair tied back, and all hair ties are to be plain red or royal blue (no florals, stripes or patterns).
- Extreme and radical fashion hairstyles are **not acceptable**. Haircuts are not to be less than a "Number 3" and undercuts are not permitted.
- Jewellery must **not** be worn to school, with the exception of a wristwatch. Any Fitness trackers or smart watches with internet access, are not to be worn to school, or alternatively, the internet access feature, is to be disabled.

If it is necessary for earrings to be worn, these are only to be plain gold, or plain silver studs, or sleeper style
earrings, with only one earring permitted in each ear:- please remember that coloured, gemstones, or any
drop styles, are not permitted.

# **Year 2 Tranby House Excursion**

On Tuesday 19<sup>th</sup> March, the Year Two students ventured to Tranby House (Peninsula Farm) for an excursion that supports our HASS unit on "Technology in the Past and Present". The students came to school dressed in 'olden days' clothing to further immerse themselves in the experience of life in the 1800s. At Tranby House, the students learnt



about the traditional owners of the land - the Whadjuk Noongar people - and that Tranby House is on an area of land know as Wu-Rat Woorat. The students then learnt about the Hardey family, before eagerly participating in some activities that enhanced their understanding of technology in the past and how this impacted daily life. The students applied their knowledge of past and present technology to match artefacts from the past to their present-day counterpart. Some of these artefacts included a washing board, a bow tie press and a chamber pot. Following the artefact matching activity, the students were led on a guided tour of Tranby House to see what the house would have looked like back in the 1800s when the Hardey family lived there. They were

fascinated by the different technologies that were in the past, and even got to have a go at ironing a linen square! A highlight of the day for many students was learning about windmills and making their own windmill craft. The day finished with the students enjoying some 'old fashioned' games such as horseshoe quoits, skipping, hopscotch and egg and spoon races. Thank you to all of the wonderful parent helpers who came and assisted the Year Two students on the day of the excursion.


#### Stations of the Cross

2024 Fees and Charges were invoiced and were emailed to all carers/guardians in January 2024. A current statement will be emailed to all families at the end of Term One. This statement will serve as receipt for payments already made. Should you have a current direct debit in place, no further action is required on your behalf.

A number of families have not returned the required payment commitment form. If you have not already done so, please complete and return the Payment Option Form via email <a href="mailto:finance@shpsh.wa.edu.au">finance@shpsh.wa.edu.au</a> – this was due on the 16 February 2024.

Health Care Card Fee Discount Scheme – To access the Health Care Card Assistance Scheme, an eligible means tested Centrelink card must be presented to our Administration Office and a HCC Fee Discount Scheme form completed. The card must be in the name of the parent /guardian who is responsible for payment of fees. Should a valid card not be presented upon expiry of an existing card, any previous discount applied, will be reversed and the applicable fees and charges will be invoiced for your account in line with the expired card. The Health Care Discount is not applicable to Pre-Kindergarten fees.
