Dear Parents and Carers,

Stewardship- Taking responsibility for the quality of our work

All families are reminded that fee collection is a very necessary focus for the School Advisory Council, and formal collection processes will commence, in the event of failure to make contact with the School Principal to discuss any variations to fee structures, or any circumstances that have the potential to impact on your family's obligation to meet their outstanding 2024, and or any overdue School Fees.

Sacred Heart Primary School will continue to offer a **Pre Kindy** (Three Year old) Class, and a **Kindergarten** (Four Year old) Class in 2025. In coming weeks, we hope to conclude the **2025 Pre Kindergarten** and **2025 Kindergarten Interviews.**

Three-year-old and Four-year-old education programs operate at schools as part of an education course. Catholic **Pre Kindergarten and Kindergarten** programmes provide rich learning environments that cater for children's development across the physical, cognitive, language, social, emotional and spiritual domains. Learning occurs through planned and spontaneous play experiences that are based on the strengths, interests and needs of each child. Each child participating in our programmes in their Catholic school, is encouraged to develop a positive self-image of themselves and others as they begin to live the gospel message.

Parents of siblings, and those in the wider Parish community who are seeking a position in either of these classes for 2025, are encouraged to contact the School Office and submit their downloadable Enrolment Forms. Places are strictly limited to twenty students for our "Little Hearts" Pre Kindy Class, and thirty students in Kindergarten.

Catholic Identity- Living out the teachings of Jesus

As we commenced Term Two, our Year three children completed their Sacrament of Penance in the Church, after their Parent Child Penance Workshop and a wonderful Class Retreat that Miss Danica Gullotto facilitated with skill and enthusiasm. Thank you, Danica. It was a very positive step in the children's faith development, and their first sacramental experience after their Baptism. We are so pleased as a school, to support families in the parish based and family focused faith journey.

In Week Three, preparations for the special sacrament of First Holy Communion (Eucharist) was our focusthe Year Four children participated in their Parent Child Eucharist Workshop in the School Hall and on the following Thursday, undertook their Eucharist Retreat here with their classmates. Parents who are interested in accessing this service are requested to make contact with the School Principal, Mrs McGuire, and will be provided with further information regarding Tuition fees and rebates schedules.

Fee Statements were emailed to all families at the start of 2024 and at the end of Term 1 2024. These statements are a reminder of fees outstanding as well as a receipt for all monies received to date. Should you have an existing direct debit in place, no further action is required on your behalf.

Every family is required to complete and **submit a new Payment Option form each year.**Payment arrangements carried over from last year are not automatically adjusted to allow

for any increase / decrease in fees. It is a school requirement to complete the payment option form to ensure the correct number of instalments, at the correct payment amount, are being made for your fees to **be paid by 30 November 2024.** In committing to a particular payment plan, it enables the school to accurately budget and thereby provide the necessary resources for our students.

If you have not already done so, please complete and return the Payment Option Form via email finance@shpsh.wa.edu.au

Please be advised that our Finance System **identifies the female parent/guardian/carer as the primary contact** for Fees and Charges. This means that when the annual fees are generated, the fee statement will automatically be emailed to the female parent/guardian/carer. The system will be enhanced in the future to enable both parents/guardians/carers to receive the statements.

In the interim, should you wish this to be amended to the male parent/guardian/carer, please could you advise us as soon as possible for us to amend your specific account. If you have advised us of this in the past, then no further action is required.

Health Care Card Fee Discount Scheme – To access the Health Care Card Assistance Scheme, an eligible means tested Centrelink card must be presented to our Administration Office and a HCC Fee Discount Scheme form completed. The card must be in the name of the parent /guardian who is responsible for payment of fees. Should a valid card not be presented upon expiry of an existing card, any previous discount applied, will be reversed and the applicable fees and charges will be invoiced for your account in line with the expired card. The HCC Fee Discount cannot be applied to students in Pre-Kindergarten.
